This book is an impressive portfolio of works by sixty of the most popular artists currently working in New Zealand. It is designed as an introduction for those who are just starting out to buy the work of local artists and as an up-to-date reference for those art buyers who already collect New Zealand art.

The resulting collection covers a wide spectrum of styles, concepts and techniques, with the artists ranging from young talent that has just burst onto the scene, through well-known names, to a few true legends of New Zealand painting. Among them are no fewer than three artists who were finalists in the Adam Portraiture Awards 2006, including its winner. It will also be seen how Maori and Pacific Island influences have contributed to our unique New Zealand art style.

This book gives only brief (art-related) biographical details of the artists and makes no attempt to comment or critique their works. However it is possible to get some insight into how their talents have developed, with many having received awards or prizes and other recognition throughout their journeys.

It is hoped that this book will be used as a stimulus to begin collecting New Zealand art and as a reference to some of the wide range of talent our country has to offer. The artists featured here are just some of those whose works seem to be appealing to a great number of Kiwi art buyers.

Denis Robinson originally trained in Art and Design, and has spent his career participating in and studying New Zealand art and its artists. A top graphic designer in his own right, he was elected a Professional Member of the Designers Institute of NZ, with specialisation in publication design.

Having travelled widely, his interest in fine art and his experience in marketing gained him managerial positions in major art galleries in Auckland.

As an independent art and publishing consultant, he initiated the inaugural Auckland Art Fair held in 2005, and in that same year curated the traveling exhibition 'Influence and Inspiration - a visual journey through New Zealand Painting' sponsored by financial services company ABN Amro Craigs.


His ongoing contact with most dealer galleries and many artists throughout the country, gives him unique access to a wide range of their current works.

Introduction

New Zealand has had a short but highly innovative art history by old world standards. For the past 170 years artists have been attracted to the bright light and clear colours of New Zealand. A series of influential artists from Europe passed on their skills in the early days, which over time has blended with the indigenous Maori and Pacific influences to produce a unique and refreshing style in visual art. This coupled with isolation brings an innovative creativity to our artists work.

This book is an impressive portfolio of works by sixty of the most popular artists currently working in New Zealand. It is designed

as an introduction for those who are just starting out to collect the work of local artists and as an up-to-date reference for those who already support the works of local painters. It is intended as a follow-up to Elizabeth Caughey's successful book Art New Zealand Today (also by Saint Publishing) and for this reason, artists who were included in the previous book have not been considered for this publication.


The Artists


Artists have been selected by the following criteria: their popularity as defined by sales of their works (over 80 dealer galleries throughout the country were asked to nominate artists); their reputations both in their own regions, nationally and

internationally; and in the case of some newer artists, by the potential they have shown from the initial impact they have made on the art-buying public. The resulting collection covers a wide spectrum of styles, concepts and techniques, with the artists ranging from young talent that has just burst onto the scene, through some well-known names, to a few true legends of New Zealand painting. Among them are no fewer than three artists who were finalists in the Adam Portraiture Awards 2006, including its winner Freeman White.

This book gives only brief (art related) biographical details of

the artists and makes no attempt to comment or critique their works. However it is possible to get some insight into how their talents have developed, with many having received awards or prizes and other recognition throughout their journey. During the compilation of the book I have been very impressed with the level of professionalism shown in my dealings with the individual artists and by the dealer galleries, in the way they represented their artists. I have also noticed a growing level of sophistication in the presentation and marketing of their works which I am sure has helped the number of artists who have built themselves a loyal following of buyers, both within New Zealand and internationally.





Art appreciation is a very personal thing and tastes vary as much as there are people, but there is a widely used 'three-word yardstick' to consider when choosing art - Idea, Technique and Emotion. Idea – What is the artist's original concept or inspiration? Technique – How well has the work been executed in the chosen medium? Emotion – How does the painting affect you? (e.g. memories, joy, stimulation, revulsion etc.). This can all be summed-up by the old saying "I'll know what I like when I see it!"










